

Installing Patient Files on Android Devices

You need to install the Handbase via the Android Market first before you can install the databases.

For countries with no Handbase App found in the Market .

Do the following:

According to Handbase developer:

We do have an option for purchasing the APK directly from our site in case a user doesn't need to use a Unicode based language. Please see below:

Since your device is unable to purchase HanDBase via Android Market, we wanted to make sure we could meet your needs in another way. To meet this need, Dave has set up a special solution that will allow you to purchase the HanDBase APK file via our site.

To do this, visit this page:

<http://www.ddhsoftware.com/priority.html>

and enter the priority code: **androidnomarket**

This will provide you with the APK file only. You will need to install this directly to your Android device by downloading it using your Android device.

Please note that you may have to enable the installation of non-Market applications. To do this, please visit Settings -> Application Settings -> Unknown Sources (Check this box).

Additionally, please note that since you are not using Android Market for this purchase, you will need to periodically check back for updates. You will be able to download updated APK files via your account at <http://www.ddhsoftware.com/download.html> HanDBase will not automatically update as applications purchased via Android Market will.

We hope this helps to meet your needs. Should you have any questions or run into any problems with purchasing your copy of HanDBase for Android, please let me know. (from Brian Houghton of Handbase)

Once you have Handbase inside the Android, you may now copy the databases found in Computer> Drive C> MyPatients4 and paste it to the Handbase folder that appears when your Android device is plugged via USB to your computer just like a External Memory device. After pasting it in the Handbase folder it will now appear in the Handbase app.

Another way of transferring data from your desktop to the Android is via email. You may attach the databases found in Computer> Drive C> MyPatients4 folder(particularly the 3 most important :rmPatientFiles, rmVisitLink and the rmAdmitLink, not the one with HDF).

How to use:

In your Android device click Handbase app

Make sure that the category is set as Patient Files

Now open rmPatientFiles, click the plus sign at the lower left corner to make a new record for a new patient.

Type the name at the space provided

Click AdmitLinkRelate if the patient is admitted.

Click VisitLinkrelate is the patient is for Out-Patient recording only. Much like that of the Windows version.

Two way Synchronizing the from Android to Desktop is possible but you need to purchase a desktop software called Handbase Android Plus for Desktop at www.ddhsoftware.com.
